Objectives of the webinar are to:

- 1. Increase the role of sustainable forestry in training, broaden the content of training and increase understanding of how it is addressed in different ways across Europe.
- 2. map the perceptions of different European countries regarding the topic. This could facilitate the creation of a network which would further focus on improving sustainable forest management education on vocational level.
- 3. Define the differences in SFM from different European countries in terms of other aspects of sustainable forestry: economics, culture and sociality.
- 4. Disseminate information on project results and to gather around the topic participants from all over Europe to develop sustainable forest management training and disseminate the project activities

Target audience and actors

The webinar is primarily directed a) experts, teachers, stakeholders as well as the project consortium together to elaborate findings on Activity 2; b) all stakeholders who indirectly or directly benefit from the biodiversity of forests, wood procurement or other ecosystem services such as carbon sequestration, water management, aesthetical aspects or cultural values, benefit from the results; c) educational institutions, trainers and researchers interested in developing sustainable forest management training d) local association and Centers of Environmental Education(CEA).

The key speakers will be among researchers, forestry experts and technical staff from forestry, social and recreative associations. They will be selected based on relevant experiences and proven contributions to sustainability of forestry.
